DESIGN TIP

How do you decide which mode to use?

- First, decide if you want the student to watch or perform the steps themselves.
- If the student will be watching, decide if the procedure is simple enough to use as captured or if it is likely to need some fine-tuning and editing.
- If the students will be practicing, decide if you want to give them hints or ask them to remember the steps on their own without help.
